Minutes March 8, 2010

Co-Chair Gene Leifeld called the meeting to order at 1700 hours

- Minutes of the February meeting were available to the members for review. **Gary Selness motioned to accept the minutes. Rose Weber seconded the motion.** The chair called for the question, **members approved the motion.**
- Gary Selness presented the Treasurer Report. Expenses for the Game Day February 21, 2010 at United Redeemer Church. **\$84.03 at Super America for pop, \$86.57 for (6) pizzas at Jimmy's Pizza.** Balance in the checkbook to date **\$2448.43.** **Chair Gene Leifeld motioned to accept the Treasurer report. Don Buck seconded the motion.** Chair called for the question, **members approved the motion.**
- Stacy passed around photos from Game Day in February. The photo's are on face book at this time. Stacy is reorganizing the CHI website and will have a tab with these photos and more information in the future. Total of 22 students attended the event.
- Stacy is attending an Advisory Board meeting in Red Wing on Thursday March 11, 2010
- Discussion on CHI business cards. Stacy contacted Theis printing in Zumbrota and two options were presented. (1) Single card for at a cost of \$45.00 for 250 cards, (2) Bi-fold card at a cost of \$67.00 for 250 cards. **Rose Weber motioned to purchase 250 bi-fold cards at a cost of \$67.00. Gary Selness seconded the motion.** The Chair called for the question, **board members approved the motion.**
- Discussion on CHI letters and Prom Cards for ZM High School students attending the 2010 prom. The board decided to for distribution of prom letters to approach the following businesses. Flowers on Main, and Phenomenal Women (tuxedo rentals). Stacy passed copies of the letter to members. Members agreed on the wording for the letter and Stacy will change the wording format to include Zumbrota CHI. The remainder of the letters to be distributed to ZM-High School Counselor Angie Hunstad and School Social Worker Cheryl Kuss. Bi-fold cards to be distributed at the high school.

- Stacy discussed the Tobacco Diversion Program. Referrals for the program are for 1st and 2nd Offenses. Gary Selness explained that the **program is voluntary** and officers will be able to offer this option to the offender and the parents. The cost for the class is (\$100.00) and the class is about 4 hours long. Should the offender decide not to attend the class, the cost is still \$100.00 with a citation and a court appearance. The program is through a private organization known as Financial Crimes.
- Chair Gene Leifeld spoke on the **Softball Madness July 25, 2010 at Covered Bridge Ball field.** The ball field is reserved for that afternoon in July. **The event is from 1-4 PM. Participants will need to bring their own equipment.** The event will be in the ZM-Community Education Summer booklet. Registration is through Community ED. Food will be provided at the event. If there is inclement weather on this date. **The alternate date for this event is Sunday August 1, 2010.** These dates have been confirmed with the softball association.
- Don Buck spoke on an article in the **Rochester Post Bulletin concerning the use of alcohol, depression and teen suicides.** Stacy will look at the option of placing information on the website regarding this information.
- **Sunday April 18, 2010 is CHI Sunday** and Stacy will have additional information on this after the Faith Sector leader meeting on Friday. Stacy will present information on Youth Focus surveys at the April meeting.
- **Tuesday morning April 6, 2010** Chair Gene Leifeld and Stacy Larson will attend Zumbrota Rotary breakfast meeting. Presentation on the Zumbrota Chemical Health Initiative.
